Use: Wixie blank page and stickers	Write a comic strip that depicts a scene from your book. Be sure to include characters, setting and actions. Use Wixie template, "Comic Strip"	After reading an informational book, determine the book's main idea. Give supporting details that prove the main idea. Use Wixie template, "Main Idea Umbrella" or "Main Idea Burger"	Write an autobiography about your life and your accomplishments. Make one page per year. Use Wixie template, "All about Me"	Using the Wixie template, "Book Cover", Create a book cover for the book you read. Make sure it looks different from the actual book cover. Include the title, author, illustrator, and a picture including setting, characters.

Use Wixie template, "Trifold Brochure"	Write a journal entry about an important life lesson you learned while reading about the individual and how it will help you in the future.	Create a character mobile. Place all of the characters on the mobile and include 1 trait for each Under each trait, select a supporting quote from the novel.

After reading your biography, design a cereal box for your person.	Design a personality collage for 2 of your favorite characters from the novel (they do NOT have to be the main characters. Include at least 10 words and/or pictures for each.
